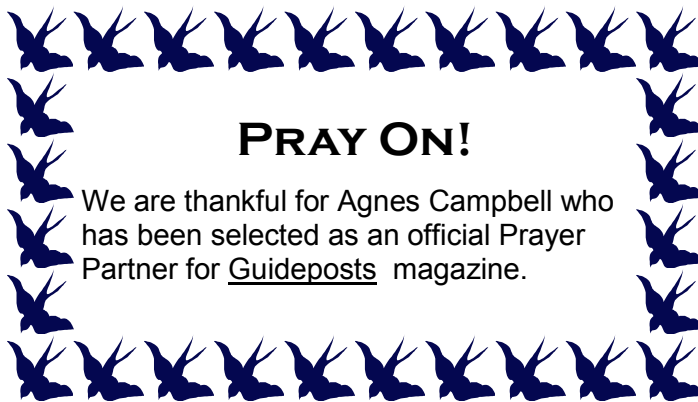


WE WELCOME NEW MEMBERS

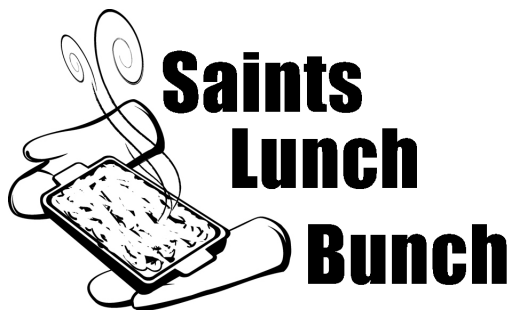
