### Worship Practices

**Worship Art**—This Lenten season we are displaying art in the Narthex by the children and youth of FPC and children of Southern Heartland Art under the instruction of Elise Hammond.

Our worship guide cover today is a digital painting by Rev. Lauren Wright Pittman titled "Who Do You Say That I Am?" The following is an excerpt from the artist's statement:

I don't know if this was a moment of clarity for Peter, if he was regurgitating the answer he thought Jesus wanted to hear, or if he was trying to convince himself that dropping everything and following this man was worth it, but I imagine this was a breakthrough for Peter.

I wanted to capture this as a moment of seeing and being seen. Jesus sees him as more than Simon, a fisherman and son of Jonah, and renames him Peter, the blessed foundation through which his ministry would take root and continue to grow. Jesus sees Peter through the eyes of God.

Peter sees Jesus as more than a teacher and companion. He sees through the veil of confusion concerning Jesus' identity. He doesn't see him as the reincarnation of a former prophet, or another contemporary baptizer pointing the way. He names Jesus as the "anointed one," the one his people have so desperately longed for. Peter proclaims Jesus as Messiah and Son of the living God.






## What do you believe?

### Discerning and Creating a Statement of Faith

Take a sheet of paper and divide it into **five or ten-year increments** across the top of the page. (We've left the back of this sheet empty for you to use if you'd like!)

Then **highlight formative faith moments within those age periods**, jotting down significant events that occurred. An event could be hearing a sermon, reading a book or poem, attending a conference as a youth or adult, an encounter with another person, a conversation—you name it!

Then recount **the ways you have seen God** at work in your life. Recount also those events in which **your faith was tested**, when life was turbulent.

### As you work on this, keep the following questions in mind?

- Output How did a given event draw you closer to (or keep you further away from) God?
  - Or How was your spiritual life strengthened (or weakened) at that moment?
- What were your earliest experiences of faith?
  - When was the first time you remember believing in God?
- When did you decide to become active in a church and why?
- Who has been the most influential person in your spiritual growth?
  - How has that person influenced you?
- What speaks to you about communion and baptism?
- What things make believing in God difficult for you?
- How do you experience God most? Through worship, nature, friends, family, Bible study, people who live as examples of faith, prayer, meditation and contemplation, the arts (music, poetry, architecture, etc.), service to others, nature, or something else?
- What is your understanding of God?
- ♦ Who is Jesus?
- Or How have you experienced the presence of the Holy Spirit in your life?

**Explain your faith in one sentence.** We invite you to write your statement of faith and keep it where you can be reminded of and reflect on it during times of great hope or strife. Put it in your journal, hang it on your fridge, place it in your Bible, share it with your loved ones (Neeley loves to read faith statements if you'd like a captive reader), or whatever the Spirit calls you to do.
