Worship Practices

Worship Art—This Lenten season we are displaying art in the Narthex by the children and youth of FPC and children of Southern Heartland Art under the instruction of Elise Hammond. Our worship guide cover today is a digital composition of two artworks from some of our FPC Kids: a color pencil drawing by Paisley Lane (age 9) and a painting by Greer Holder (age 10).

Cantata—Today's proclamation of the word is largely composed of a cantata titled *No Greater Sacrifice* with music and orchestration by Larry Shackley, and lyrics and narration by Pamela Martin. The following is an excerpt from the forward by Shackley.

The inspiration for this cantata initially comes from the book of Hebrews, in which the author reminds us that Jesus paid the penalty for our sins, He "sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high... being made so much better than the angels" (Hebrews 1:3-4). The following chapters demonstrate again and again the uniqueness and superiority of Jesus Christ and His sacrifice.

No Greater Sacrifice examines the idea in light of five key events of Holy Week. Not only do we find there is no greater sacrifice, but there is no greater king and no greater servant than the Lord Jesus. And through it all, He demonstrated the greatest obedience and the greatest love as He laid down His life for His friends.

Children in Worship—We have a "Children in Worship" guiding brochure available in the Narthex! This brochure is intended to serve as an aid to parents and other members of our congregation in welcoming our children to worship. Children are always welcome to wiggle and giggle in the pews at FPC! During worship children are invited to join us at the front of the Sanctuary for a time of Wondering with God's Children. Afterwards, children planning to go to the nursery will be escorted downstairs by Pastor Neeley or Pastor Erin. If you need help finding the nursery, you are invited to ask an usher to point the way. If your child needs to leave the Sanctuary for whatever reason, please accompany them throughout the building.


