

Worship Practices

Communion

All are invited to come forward to take communion. The ushers will guide you to two stations on either side of the Lord's table to receive the bread and the cup. You may choose to receive prepackaged communion elements or a gluten-free option which are available at the Lord's table. If you are not physically able to come forward and would still like to receive communion, please let an usher know and it will be brought to you. Communion elements are taken to the nursery for children to

participate in the sacrament. If you would not like to receive communion, you are welcome to stay in your seat for a time of prayerful reflection.

Children in Worship

We have a new "Children in Worship" guiding brochure available in the Narthex! This brochure is intended to serve as an aid to parents and other members of our congregation in welcoming our children to worship.

Children are always welcome to wiggle and giggle in the pews at FPC! During worship children are invited to join us at the front of the Sanctuary for a time of Wondering with God's Children. Afterwards, children planning to go to the nursery will be escorted downstairs by Pastor Neeley or Pastor Erin. This is to help you stay in worship and us get them to the nursery safely. If you need help finding the nursery, you are invited to ask an usher to point the way.

Friendship Registers

In each pew there is a pad with a black cover that we invite everyone to fill out. If the Friendship Register is nearest to you, please fill it out and pass it down the pew so it can reach everyone. When you pass it on, we invite you to introduce yourself to your pew friends! We encourage visitors and newcomers to connect with us by filling out the Friendship Register so we can be sure to send you a message to thank you for joining us.

Sound System

Please know we recognize the need for improving our sound system. We have new microphones and we are evaluating new settings while we plan for better solutions. Currently, we encourage congregants who are hearing impaired to move closer to the front near the main speakers.

Sermon Series

"Closer and Closer"

The Resurrection means deeper relationships with God and one another!

At Easter, we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead, but this is no ghostly apparition.

Jesus returns in the flesh to be close once again with his friends and to bring them closer with

one another. There is tenderness and physicality highlighted in the resurrection narratives, people coming together to hear and respond to this amazing news. Before Jesus' followers become heroic saints of the church, they are simply a group of friends hearing and telling one another a story for which they can barely find words. Like bedtime stories and old family lore, we share our stories in close and safe relationships so that we will be equipped to boldly share the story of Jesus in the world!

May we grow closer to God and one another as a people of the Resurrection!



This week's worship guide cover is one of the photos sent to the Church in 1995 for an update on our *Toward 2000* capital campaign. The following text accompanied the "photo album" portion of the update. To see the full selection of photos visit *fpccov.org/history* and click "Building the Sanctuary 1995."

In the shadow of the courthouse clock the first shovels of dirt were turned and we started to come out of the ground during the summer of 1994. A giant crane appeared on the scene and all the community began to watch as we started to change more than ever before the skyline of our community but ever still in the shadows of important parts of our heritage.

As the framework began to rise in early autumn the size and beauty of our project began to be more apparent. As the front entrance began to take shape it became impossible to drive by from any direction without staring in admiration. A green insulating skin was attached before winter arrived and with the completion of roofing and installation of windows we were "dried in" and soon ready for brick to go up. The lofty ceiling and brilliant glass were viewed up close by members after worship service January 15, 1995.

A "Crowning Moment" was literally that, on February 2, 1995 as Pott's Construction's tall crane hoisted the Cross and anchored it to the apex of the roof over our new sanctuary building. Our oldest member, Donald Stephenson (b. 1911), was there. A large color photo was on the front page of *The Covington News* along with a quote in large bold-face type from Donald Stephenson: "I was born in this town and have lived my whole life here. This is the first time there has ever been a cross on top of a church in [downtown] Covington."


