# Confirmation

### What is Confirmation?

The word confirm, from the Latin *confirmare*, means "to strengthen." At Confirmation, the Holy Spirit and the church's prayers strengthen those who are being confirmed. This strengthening includes preparing individuals who were baptized in infancy to 1) profess their personal faith and the faith of the church and 2) declare their intent to take part actively and responsibly in the church's worship and mission. For those not baptized as children, Confirmation includes both Baptism and a profession of faith.

Confirmation is an act of covenant renewal that includes 3 parties:

- 1) God confirms a youth's baptismal identity as a child of God, whether baptism occurred in childhood or will happen at Confirmation worship
- 2) The youth confirms their faith in Jesus and the teachings of the church
- 3) The congregation confirms the youth's spiritual gifts for ministry & active church membership

# Worship Practices

Children in Worship—We have a "Children in Worship" guiding brochure available in the Narthex! This brochure is intended to serve as an aid to parents and other members of our congregation in welcoming our children to worship. Children are always welcome to wiggle and giggle in the pews at FPC! During worship children are invited to join us at the front of the Sanctuary for a time of Wondering with God's Children. Afterwards, children planning to go to the nursery will be escorted downstairs by Pastor Neeley or Pastor Erin. This is to help you stay in worship and us get them to the nursery safely. If you need help finding the nursery, you are invited to ask an usher to point the way.

**Friendship Registers**—In each pew there is a pad with a black cover that we invite everyone to fill out. If the Friendship Register is nearest to you, please fill it out and pass it down the pew so it can reach everyone. When you pass it on, we invite you to introduce yourself to your pew friends! We encourage visitors and newcomers to connect with us by filling out the Friendship Register so we can be sure to send you a message to thank you for joining us.

**Sound System**—We are excited to announce that Session has approved updating the sound system in our Sanctuary! Our sound system has not been updated in several years and we believe this is a valuable way to make our church welcoming and accessible for all of God's people. The new system is designed to improve the sound in the space, not only in volume but in clarity and it will include a Bluetooth hearing aid connectivity option. 




