Special Guest—We welcome guest artist Scott Fuss as he paints an interpretation of our scripture today.

Ever grateful for the opportunity to share the Good News, Scott Fuss uses artwork created from materials that have a story, to tell a story.

Using salvaged cardboard, packing crates, discarded paint and pallets, Scott reveals artwork with a message that we, like these overlooked materials, can be repurposed and used to make something of beauty. Artwork that is like us "Imperfectly Perfect".

Along with fellow musicians, Scott has performed "Cardboard Art & Music" for churches, coffee houses, prisoners, and judges... anywhere someone needs to hear the transforming message of Christ.

How does a weary world rejoice?—When our world is hard, when days are long and cumbersome, when our bodies and spirits are weary, it proves challenging to see JOY, be JOY, experience JOY. Thus, we need one another to remember the joy! So this Advent season we will join in the rituals of our faith – telling the story of God with us – and in doing so explore the question – How does a weary world rejoice?

Worship Art—This week's worship guide cover art is a painting on reclaimed wood by Gracie Morbitzer titled *The Visitation*. This piece was featured in the 2023-24 Presbyterian Women bible study *Sacred Encounters: The Power and Presence of Jesus in Luke-Acts* as the art for "Lesson One: Elizabeth's Sacred Encounter". The artist's statement is as follows:

Though most images of this greeting between Mary and her cousin Elizabeth upon discovery of their miraculous pregnancies show the first, joyful part of their interaction, I wanted to make sure that the scared, confused, and worried aspects of their conditions were portrayed as well. Anyone with children, especially in the United States today, can, I'm sure, understand. Both of these saints lost their children, and will then, hopefully, guide us on a path to reform that will save ours.

The Visitation is a piece in Gracie Morbitzer's series The Modern Saints. The artist's statement on the series is as follows:

Ancient icons of saints portray everyone as old, white, expressionless, and hard to tell apart. I believe these pieces of Church imagery can turn modern-thinking people away from the influences of the saints, and even the Church itself.

My goal was to re-imagine these extraordinary people as modern, everyday humans... because that is exactly what they were, and they remind us of ourselves. They show us that we can all be saints just like them.

Worship Practices

Communion—All are invited to come forward to take communion. The ushers will guide you to two stations on either side of the Lord's table to receive the bread and the cup. You may choose to receive prepackaged communion elements or a gluten-free option which are available at the Lord's table. If you are not physically able to come forward and would still like to receive communion, please let an usher know and it will be brought to you. Communion elements are taken to the nursery for children to participate in the sacrament. If you would not like to receive communion, you are welcome to stay in your seat for a time of prayerful reflection.

Sound System—We are excited to announce that the new sound system has been installed in the Sanctuary! The new system is designed to improve the sound in the space, not only in volume but in clarity and includes a Bluetooth hearing aid connectivity option. We are still testing and figuring out the settings and we appreciate your patience during this adjustment period. Once we fully understand the settings and capabilities, we will hold lessons on how to connect with the Bluetooth.

Children in Worship—We have a "Children in Worship" guiding brochure available in the Narthex! This brochure is intended to serve as an aid to parents and other members of our congregation in welcoming our children to worship. Children are always welcome to wiggle and giggle in the pews at FPC! During worship children are invited to join us at the front of the Sanctuary for a time of Wondering with God's Children. Afterwards, children planning to go to the nursery will be escorted downstairs by Pastor Neeley or Pastor Erin. This is to help you stay in worship and us get them to the nursery safely. If you need help finding the nursery, you are invited to ask an usher to point the way.

Friendship Registers—In each pew there is a pad with a black cover that we invite everyone to fill out. If the Friendship Register is nearest to you, please fill it out and pass it down the pew so it can reach everyone. When you pass it on, we invite you to introduce yourself to your pew friends! We encourage visitors and newcomers to connect with us by filling out the Friendship Register so we can be sure to send you a message to thank you for joining us.






