


"Jammies and Jesus"

Epiphany Sunday

We will celebrate Epiphany Sunday on January 3, 2021. Epiphany Sunday is when we celebrate the Magi bringing gifts to Jesus. In the Gospel of Matthew, we read the Magi followed a star in the East to find baby Jesus in the manger. Therefore, this year we will participate in a prayer practice of "Star Words". Receiving a Star Word on Epiphany is a growing practice in the Protestant tradition. This word is to be a word of intention for us in the new year. We trust that God uses multiple ways to guide us and speak to us. Star words are one such lens that might provide us a way to look for God in our midst, both actively and in hindsight. We trust that it is often easy to miss God in our daily midst. Having an intention word to consider both in present days, as well as to reflect on at the end of the year, allows for us to see God in ways we may not have seen God before. 
