The light shines in the darkness,

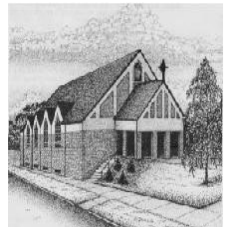
and the darkness doesn't extinguish the light.
