punch drinks, sweetened Kool-aid, toilet paper

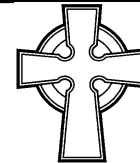

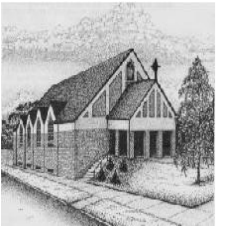
